Course Description: This course will cover assumption, confirmation, & positioning of command; situation evaluation; communications, deployment management; strategy and incident planning; organization; review, evaluation, & revision; continue of command, and transfer, & termination of command.

Statement of Prerequisites: None

Goal: Provide students with the necessary tools to be successful in the implementation of the Incident Management System and also implement key strategy and tactics while operating on an emergency scene.

Outcomes: Verbal and written communication is a huge part of this course. Students will give presentations, and verbal radio reports. Students will also have written assignments. Listening skills will be tested every day with a verbal quiz over the reading assignment. Specific outcomes are listed at the beginning of each chapter.

Methodology: This course will be presented in a lecture multi-media format with interactive student participation. Interactive student discussion and small group exercises will make up a large part of this course.

Evaluation Criteria: Grades in this course will be based on written exams and quizzes.

There will be no make-up points, quizzes, or tests unless discussed prior to your absence. You must take responsibility for yourself!

Quizzes, and tests:
