## **Course Description:**

General principles of pathology as well as disease processes and radiographic manifestations of specific body systems will be covered. A portion of the course will be devoted to the study of cancer and its radiographic appearance for the various systems.

- 3. identify basic anatomic structures on both diagrams and radiographs of the system in question.
- 4. be able to define terminology related to pathology and the system in study.
- 5. describe the various pathologic conditions affecting the system including signs, symptoms and radiographic manifestations.
- 6. utilize their pathology knowledge to observe and interview a patient so as to provide the best possible history to the radiologist.
- 7. be able to make appropriate changes in technical factors required for obtaining optimal quality radiographs in-patients with certain underlying pathologic conditions.
- 8. gain a better understanding of a given pathology, and be able to deliver individualized quality patient care by better use of appropriate communication and physical patient care skills.

I. OBSERVATIONS: Each student will spend sessions of two 2-hour blocks with the radiologists while reading radiographs. The reading time will total 4 hours for the semester. These times can be scheduled with Laurie Weaver. A log sheet must be signed by the radiologist and turned in no later than December 4<sup>th</sup>: 50 points

Students will schedule the reading room observations at the Wyoming Medical Center, Outpatient Radiology Office of Casper, Sheridan, Riverton, or Gillette Hospitals as follows: (Students at outside clinical sites may complete these observations at those sites)

October: 2 hours during the week 7:30 a.m.-9:30 a.m.

Nov./Dec: 2 hours during the week 7:30 a.m.-9:30 a.m.

The times listed are suggested to give the student the best experience during their observation. **Observations are to be completed outside of clinical hours** 

**II. JOURNAL/ CASE STUDY PRESENTATIONS:** A pathology journal will be utilized to give the student a practical working knowledge of Radiographic Pathology through experience, exploration and research.

During clinical education the student will keep a working journal of interesting pathology cases throughout the semester. This documentation must include the following if applicable:

- < Exam Performed/Explanation of procedure
- < Patient history
- < Any changes needed due to pathology, positioning, contrast media used, patient condition (patient care) and technique.
- < A complete explanation of the diagnosed pathology received from the exam results Include a definition and explanation of the pathology and how it relates to the items listed above. Define any term in the report that involves this pathology.
- < Any additional tests required to diagnose this pathology. These tests must not only include imaging exams but lab, scopes, etc. You may have to investigate further to find this information. Include possible treatment options as well.
- The length of each individual pathology report should be ¾ to 1 page in length.

The student will document a minimum of **15** cases. The student will present **2** case studies from his/her journal entries in class. The criteria listed above must be included in the presentation and films demonstrating the pathology must be shown. See course schedule for presentation dates, 2 presentations will be given by each student on the dates listed on the syllabus.

The completed journal must be typed and neatly organized.

Journal 100 points/Presentations 50 points

The completed journal is due December 3<sup>rd</sup>.

III. CHAPTER QUIZZES: A quiz will be given prior to each lecture covering the material for the upcoming chapter. Students can prepare for the quizzes by reading the chapter and completing the required workbook section for each chapter prior to the class. Quizzes will be given as follows: Chapters 1&2, 3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10. Quiz points vary according to chapters. Quizzes cannot be made up after the lecture covering that quizzes chapter (See attendance policy in this syallabus). Students who do not attend class on a quiz day will be given a 0 for that quiz. See course content for quiz and lecture schedule. Assignments will be required for the guest speakers and will count as quiz points.

**IV. Final Exam:** A comprehensive final exam will be given during finals week. This exam will present radiographs with different pathologies. Each radiograph will be accompanied by a patient history and other pertinent information regarding the radiographic pathology. The student will review the case history and radiograph and identify the proper pathology for each of the radiographs presented. Students will be allowed to use their pathology book to research the correct answer. Each student will schedule a date during finals week to take the test. Only three students will be allowed to take the exam at the same time. This will allow each student to be able to take the time needed to review each radiograph. 200 points
